## Range courtesy and safety

I've had the pleasure of being Range Safety Officer for our recent fun shoots. We have had a great turnout, and a good time has been had by all. I would however like to take a moment to remind everyone of the proper safe and courteous range procedures for both these type of events, and range usage in general.

When you arrive at the range please have your firearm cased, and unloaded. A real gun case is preferable to just a holster or shoving your firearm loose into your range bag.

Another thing I would like to remind everyone to pay close attention to is the direction of their barrel at all times. I observed on many occasions people 'fishing' (pointing the firearm straight up and bringing it down on to the target), and turning the firearm sideways to rack the slide or clear a jam (scary, as now it's pointed at your neighbor).

I would also like to remind everyone to keep their finger off the trigger, and outside of the trigger guard until the sights are on target with the barrel of the firearm pointing in a safe downrange direction. Under no circumstances should your finger be inside the trigger guard when clearing a malfunction or loading / charging the weapon.

Please remember that the RSO's are present to not only keep everyone safe, but to answer questions, and offer assistance in the case of a malfunction. Feel free to get our attention if you need us.

In conclusion, taking a little extra time to think about the finer points of range conduct can make a significantly safer, and more enjoyable shooting experience for everyone.

## Out of the Bag

Did you know that a weapon used in World War I was so terrifying that Germany lodged a diplomatic protest against its use by American forces? They said the weapon inflicted unnecessary cruelty. And the United States responded that the claim was pointless coming from a nation that used chemical weapons and flamethrowers in warfare.

It wasn't the flamethrower or the machine gun. It was Shotguns, Winchester Models 1897 and 1912's to be exact. They were used in combat after America realized how brutal trench warfare could be. The spread of the shotgun was perfect for clearing attackers from American trenches as well as clearing defenders from enemy trenches.

The War Department ordered Standard or civilian versions, Riot or shortened barrels, and Trench which had 20 inch barrels, heat shields, and bayonet lugs. The Model 97 could also be slamfired; holding the trigger and pumping the gun, all six rounds of 00 Buckshot could be fired in a little over 2 seconds with devastating effects in the trenches. The Model 97s picked up the nicknames "trench brooms" and "trench sweepers."

It was reported that American soldiers skilled in skeet shooting were placed along the front trenches to shoot hand grenades from the air, deflecting or destroying the devices before they could hurt American troops.

The Winchester Model 97 and Model 1912 were also used in World War II, Korea, and Vietnam.
