

## **CCW and You**

So you have a license to carry a pistol for self defense, now what else should you carry? Remember the scout motto, "Be Prepared." The first things that should come to mind are your CCW license and the green safety inspection card for any and all guns you are carrying. Michigan law also requires you to carry a driver's license or state ID card. Obviously these items can be in you wallet at all times.

The next logical item to consider is spare

ammo. A spare magazine, usually placed on the weak side for a tactical reload, or a speedloader for revolvers carried on the strong side for the same reason, are good to have at hand. Five or six rounds is sufficient, but even with four good tires on your vehicle, you probably carry a spare.

Equally important is a non-lethal alternative to "deadly force". Pepper spray (2% Michigan legal, of course) that sends out a stream rather than a fog or mist is very good. Other options include impact items, such as keys or a small flashlight. Be careful that you are not overly aggressive with these so that they don't become lethal weapons. Additional training will help in this area. This item should be ready at all times.

You may consider a throw away wallet or money clip. Something that looks to be of great value, but actually holds only a few one dollar bills and no personal information. If ordered to, "Give me your money" toss the wallet/clip one way and run the other. It may not seem "manly", but it sure beats a law suit!

A flashlight was mentioned as a less than lethal weapon. A hit to the back of the hand or kneecap may give you that moment to get away. Night sights on your gun will help your aim, but a flashlight will help you identify your target <u>before</u> you decide to shoot. Some flashlights are better as impact tools while others are brighter and better for actual one hand operation (for target I.D.)

As a closing thought, a 1 <sup>1</sup>/2" belt will support most of these items, and keep them available. Pockets are full of everyday items and can slow you down. Also, your CCW does not cover an edged weapon. A handy pocket knife could be called a deadly weapon and is not an option. Looking forward to seeing you at the range.


